Dear Parents and Summer Campers:

We are proud to announce our summer day camp calendar for 2022. The staff has worked hard to design an exciting program that will provide many wonderful memories in the years to come. This letter will highlight the various activities, provide specific information, and list necessary equipment. The calendar is a representation of our summer plans but will change if necessary due to weather conditions and other unforeseeable circumstances. We will keep you informed of any changes or additions using our Parent Board, which is located on your left as you walk into the building, and through email. If you have any questions, please contact me and I will assist you in any way I can.

A major focus of our camp every summer is the philosophy of kids helping kids. We would like our community of children to recognize the impact they can have when they extend themselves to help others in need. All profits from our summer show will go to support our Friends of CCC Scholarship Foundation, which provides childcare scholarships to disadvantaged and homeless children in our program, our Christmas Giving Tree, meal support, crisis assistance, and the spreading of kindness. In addition, every summer each child must commit to a community service project. This summer our community service project is in conjunction with the Lunch 4 Learners program through Food Gatherers, which provides lunches and dinners to those who are in need. Our mission is to decorate approximately 1000 paper lunch bags! We are also planning a community service project to benefit the children and families in Ukraine.

Attached to this letter are a permission slip for our overnight camp, a vacation form, a Food Agreement, Medication Permission, two registration cards, a swimming permission form, a health form including immunization record, a community service form, a photo/video release form, a licensing notebook form, and a routine transportation permission form. Please return **all** these forms by the first day of camp. Also, if possible, try to make sure your child is at camp by 9:00 AM every day for the morning camp meeting and/or morning sports and art. Our summer camp officially ends on August 26, with the starting date for fall being Tuesday, September 6. CCC will be closed on Monday, August 29 – Monday, September 5. Please fill out and return your vacation form with your first tuition payment. This will assist us in planning staff summer schedules and vacations. Thank you for being a part of our program this summer. This is our 29<sup>th</sup> anniversary of CCC and we are planning a summer of celebration and delight. We can't wait for the fun to begin!

Finally, we will provide pizza for lunch on Tuesdays, and a barbecue lunch on Fridays. You will need to provide lunch on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. We can't wait to spend the summer with your kids! We are going to have such a great time!

## **FRIENDS OF CCC FOUNDATION**

We have had an in house scholarship program for homeless and disadvantaged children since CCC was established. It has always been my mission to make sure that every child has an opportunity for a quality child care experience. Our main source of earning money for this fund has been our annual summer musical. Therefore, six years ago we began the process to establish our scholarship fund as a foundation. The foundation allows us to seek donors who might be looking for a positive way to make a tax deductible donation and allow us to provide support in other ways in addition to scholarships at CCC. Many of these things we have always been doing, but with limited funds which made them difficult things to accomplish. The foundation helps us provide emergency groceries to families, healthy meal planning, workshops for families and parents, emergency auto repairs, and many other support services for low income and disadvantaged families, as well as numerous ways to support our youth.

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All the monies we raise through our production will go to the Friends of CCC Foundation. We are thrilled to be able to provide opportunities for families to succeed and progress through their lives.

## **THEATRE COMPONENT**

The production that the children will do this summer is a loosely based version of A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, or in our case A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to CCC! It should be fun and exciting to produce. Lots of silly characters, and a crazy story! At this time, we are tentatively planning on the show being performed in the CCC theater, and having it live-streamed to the field. That could change if we feel that the show cannot be safely performed in our indoor performance space. We will keep you updated as we progress through the summer.

The show will be directed by Gayle Martin, Abby Vermeulen, and Laurie Atwood. Gayle, Laurie, and Abby are looking forward to collaborating their talents for this spectacular production. Laurie is a graduate of the University of Michigan's Theater and Musical school and has performed locally for over 40 years. They are excited to have the opportunity to work together again for this 29th year, and we are delighted to have them share their incredible talents with all of us. Gayle, who is no stranger to the summer shows at CCC, has been directing here for the past sixteen years. She is a graduate of the University of Michigan's Fine Arts Program with a major in Musical Theater and is a Professor of Dance at Washtenaw Community College. Gayle is a frequent performer in the local community as well as a choreographer for many productions. Abby is what we lovingly call a lifer at CCC. She has been here since she was a preschooler, attended summer camp, had the lead in one of our summer musicals, was an intern all through middle school and high school, and has worked every summer at CCC since she turned 18. She taught elementary school in Kansas for 5 years, and for the past 4 years has been an elementary teacher at South Arbor Academy where she won the Teacher of the Year Award!

Rehearsals will typically be on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays beginning at 10 AM until the week before opening night. On Mondays from 2-4, there will be dance/scene rehearsals, Tuesdays 2-4, dance/scene rehearsals, and on Thursdays 2-4 a review of the week. The Friday before the show opens will be a rehearsal day and any additional evening rehearsals will be announced as we go along. The performances are scheduled for August 17th – August 21st. A benefit post-show reception follows the Friday night performance. We are looking for parents who might be interesting in helping with the benefit, designing costumes, designing/building the set, helping with the program, and tickets. Please contact me if you are interested in these positions. In addition, we will ask all of you to help with the production of the show by signing up to assist on committees. We have tentatively scheduled a parent night for Tuesday, July 12th. You will get a glimpse of the show at that point in production and hear about how you can help make the show a success. Our past productions have provided many parents with an opportunity to be involved in a positive, fun experience that supports your child's participation.

## **SPORTS COMPONENT**

All the children in the summer camp will participate in a minimum of the planned sport(s) of the day. We are asking that all children try to arrive at CCC by 9am so they can all participate in the first sports/team building game of the day. In addition, we will have all sports available for all other free times throughout the day. As usual, the summer sports program is

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packed with tons of fun games and activities. The program will be spearheaded by Megan Burke with the assistance from Smitty and Abby. Our motto will be that winning or losing does not matter, it's about having fun while playing the games, and treating everybody with respect, kindness, and dignity.

The plan for sports this summer is to cover many skills, strategies, and rules involved in playing various sports and games. Throughout every game that is played there will be an emphasis on teamwork, sportsmanship, and integrity. We will cover sports such as soccer, baseball, basketball hockey, capture the flag, and ping pong. We will also be playing some new games that are variations of more popular sports. The plan is to play at least one different game every day. The goal is to help campers build and develop skills and knowledge throughout the summer, as well as to give everybody a chance to experience a variety of sports and games. There will be a ton of good games to play, and it should be a blast!

We will only set up games that allow us to maintain a safe environment to reduce the risk of injuries. As usual, Fridays will be dedicated to water sports and annual CCC traditions. Please be sure to bring a water bottle, swimsuit, and towel every day. A change of clothes tends to be a good idea as well, especially on those hot and sweaty days. We will keep you informed through the Parent Board or email as to any specific sports equipment they might need to bring to CCC for a special sports activity. The core of the program this summer will be based on learning and playing sports with cooperation, sportsmanship, and positive teamwork skill, as well as a variety of not-so-traditional activities that are always fun and amusing. All children must wear tennis shoes or closed-toe sandals. Please do not have your child wear flip flops, crocs, or open-toe shoes to camp. All the teachers involved with the sports program are ecstatic about the summer and can't wait to be out in the field with the campers. We are ready to play!

## **ART COMPONENT**

Warren Bugala has the privilege of designing the art unit for the summer of 2022. The campers will spend these eleven weeks engaged in a variety of crafts, colorful experiments, and group effort projects. Each camper should bring a white t-shirt for tie-dyeing on the first day of camp, and parents are encouraged to check the Parent Board and email regularly for any additional information. Along with the listed weekly art projects, there will be smaller activities for campers to engage in throughout the day.

The interns this summer are B Miller, Corinne Marks, Finn Lauffer, Haven Torreano, Milo VanAmburg, Rowan VanAmburg, and Vivian Waugh.

## **INTERN BIOS**

B Miller (They/Them) is 13 years old and will be 14 in August. They enjoy being an intern for CCC, and love working with all the great staff, having responsibilities, but also being a kid! They are very excited that CCC will be returning to normal this year and is most looking forward to Camp Emrich. B is looking forward to helping CCC in any way they can.

Corinne Marks would like to be an intern because she thinks that it would be a really fun experience for her, and loves being at CCC. It is a fun way to continue doing what she loves to do during the summer. Corinne is currently going to Tappan Middle School, and is really looking forward to going on all the field trips we didn't get to do last year because of COVID-19. She is also looking forward to the shaving cream fight and Capture the Flag when we are at Camp Emrich.

Finn Lauffer is thirteen years old. He likes drawing and playing video games. Finn would like to be an intern because he gets to see his friends and thinks it would be nice to help out.

Haven Torreano (They/Them) is going into eighth grade at Scarlett Middle School. They have been going to CCC since 2015, and this is their second summer as an intern. Haven loves creative projects, figure skating, playing video games, and running on the track and cross-country teams at Scarlett. During their first summer as an intern, they really enjoyed helping campers with their projects, helping with the show, and being a part of the CCC community. They are really excited to return to CCC this summer.

Milo VanAmburg is going into his Junior year at Skyline High School. He plays percussion in the school band and also does tap and ballet dancing. He has been at CCC for 7 years and is grateful for the valuable experiences he has had and the friends he has made.

Rowan VanAmburg is going into his 3rd year as an intern at CCCC. He will be a freshman at Skyline High School in the fall. Roan dances tap and ballet and also plays percussion in the school band. He strongly believes in the CCC values of respect, kindness, and dignity.

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## **EXPERIENCE DAYS / FIELD TRIPS**

This summer we have decided to plan a combination of Experience Days and Field Trips. Many of our traditional destinations are still not allowing large groups of kids to attend, and the cost of the charter bus has nearly doubled in price. I know that Field Trip days are some of the kids's favorite days of summer camp, so I have tried to create a combo that will excite and entertain all of us. We will also take smaller unscheduled trips throughout the summer, such as walking trips to parks, possibly Vets pool, Dairy Queen, and other local places as the opportunity arises. Wednesdays are our Experience Days/Field Trips except for Thursday, June 23rd, Thursday, July 14th, and Thursday, August 25th. I discovered in researching field trip destinations that most places are only open Thursday – Sunday! The costs of the Experience Days/Field Trips are included in your activity fee. The following list will provide you a brief description of what we have planned.

### **Wednesday, June 15th**

Rock and Roll Luau: This is a live Rock 'n' Roll Concert that takes us on a high energy trip back through time. Not only will we hear and enjoy some of the classic music that helped create the Rock and Roll sound, but we will also be entertained and educated about what life was like in the 1950s and 1960s.

### **Thursday, June 23rd**

Detroit Riverboat Cruise and the Detroit River Walk: The cruise will explore the sights, history, and culture of the Motor City. The kids should pack a sack lunch and some money for the snack bar on the boat and at the boat launch. We will also visit the Renaissance Center and experience the Detroit Riverwalk.

### **Wednesday, June 29th**

Rolling Hills Waterpark: We are asking that the kids come directly to Rolling Hills, and not go to CCC in the morning. The staff will greet the kids at the picnic table area next to the water park starting at 9am. They should bring a lunch and money for the snack bar. We are asking that all kids arrive no later than 11am. Please pick them up from the park by 4:30pm. We will provide more specific instructions the week of the field trip.

### **Wednesday, July 16th**

Amazing Inventions: A fascinating look at inventions that originated in our NASA program. Examples include, but are not limited to, solar panels, computer innovations, water purification systems, and robotics.

### **Thursday, July 14th**

Crossroads Village and Huckleberry Railroad: Crossroads Village is an authentic Great Lakes town from the turn of the century with over 34 historic structures and a thriving community. We will ride the Huckleberry Railroad, catch a show at the Colwell Opera House, and explore this waterfront town. Kids should bring a sack lunch and money for ice cream and souvenirs.

### **Wednesday, July 27th**

Animals Around the World: An exciting look at live animals from different countries and diverse ecosystems. While exploring desert, rainforest, and other locations, students learn about the animals indigenous to those areas. This program is up close, hands on, safe, and fun!

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## **Wednesday, August 3rd**

Imagination Station and Spaghetti Warehouse: Located in downtown Toledo, this science center is an interactive science center that has hundreds of interactive exhibits, activities, and demonstrations that teach vital science concepts. We will all have lunch at the Spaghetti Warehouse before we go to the Imagination Station.

## **Wednesday, August 10th**

Science of Music: Fun, entertaining, and upbeat, the Science of Music is a live musical presentation that infuses the audience with a greater appreciation of the sound and composition of music. Much more music than talk! It's a foot-stomping, sing-along, feel good Rock and Roll program.

## **Wednesday, August 17th**

Silky, Spiky, and Snowball: A fun, interactive magic show featuring a lively and fascinating cast. The kids will be thrilled to meet a dove (Silky,) a hedgehog (Spiky,) and a rabbit (Snowball,) in addition to Ice Cube and Snowflake!

## **Thursday, August 25th**

Caribbean Steel Drum Band: The Caribbean Steel Band is a full-time family group offering a unifying experience of singing, drumming, dancing, interaction, and excitement as the band members promote peace and understanding as offered by musical African and American contributions to the world in celebration.

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## **CAMPING**

On July 18 – 22, we are planning a week of camping at Camp Emrich in Pinckney, Michigan. It is located about 20 minutes north of Ann Arbor, just past Whitmore Lake off of US 23. We will sleep in cabins and will be able to use an art area, lodge, outdoor athletic facilities, and various large indoor areas for our dance night and skit night.

We will ask parents to transport their kids to camp on Monday morning at 9am. You are welcome to visit us any time at camp. However, sometimes certain children are fine at camp until their parents come to visit. If any child has a problem at camp, you can pick them up or we can bring them back. Typically, the children have a ball. This trip, according to the children, is one of the highlights of the program every summer. The skit night this year will include some karaoke, some skits, some dancing, and lots of comedy! The children are welcome to bring costumes. We are asking all children to be picked up from camp by 1pm on Friday afternoon.

## **SWIMMING**

Every child should bring a swimsuit and towel to CCC every day. We may go swimming at the city pools, or just run around in the sprinklers at the daycare. We do not have facilities or space to dry the wet towels and suits at the end of the day, so we will ask you to take home any wet stuff on a daily basis. Every child should also bring a backpack to school every day.

## **SUNSCREEN**

Please apply sunscreen to your child **every morning** before they come to CCC. If your child will need additional applications throughout the day, please send a bottle of sunscreen with your child's name on it and make sure the staff is aware that your child should reapply their sunscreen. They may also want to wear a hat, if you can get them to wear one.

## **FRIDAYS**

We have called most Fridays "Free Friday." This means that we will not hold rehearsal on these days unless we need to, nor plan an exciting field trip. This is designed per previous parent requests so that you may take your child out of the program on a Friday to take a long weekend or just spend a day with your child. Your child is also welcome to attend on Fridays and enjoy a more low-key day at CCC which will include goofy sports activities, a barbecue lunch, games, and art projects.

## **CELL PHONES / ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

We are requesting that the children who need to bring a cell phone to CCC put it in a designated place in the kitchen. They can use it if needed or check it periodically for messages, but they are not allowed to carry it around. The use of cell phones, iPods, gaming devices, etc. does not allow the kids to participate in an engaged fashion with the activities we have planned. We want them to be involved with each other and interacting with the staff and children.

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Dear Parents,

The children in our summer day cam are invited to an overnight camp at Camp Emrich from July 18 – 22. The camp includes cabins, a main lodge with kitchen, an art room, hiking trails, a lake within walking distance, and many natural features. We will leave on Monday, July 18 at 9am, and camp will end on Friday, July 22 at approximately 1pm. The camp is located in Pinckney, Michigan off of US 23 about 20 minutes north of Ann Arbor. Specific directions to the camp are detailed below.

Zak, Megan, Abby, and Laurie will be at camp with the children at all times. Other members of the staff will join us in the evenings as well as alternate days that they will come out to help. You are welcome to come to camp and visit at any time, and I will make frequent calls back to CCC so you can check with the staff as to how we are doing. If I have any problems with a child (home sick, sick, etc.) I will call you personally and we can make arrangements for the child to be returned or for you to come to camp. We have always had a great time camping and we are all looking forward to a fabulous experience again.

Take US 23 north to the Silver Lake exit (#55.) Turn left onto Silver Lake Road, then turn left on Whitmore Lake Road. Turn right onto Winnans Lake Road and go .5 miles to Rickett Road. Turn right on Rickett Road and go 2.5 miles to Maltby Road. Turn left on Maltby Road and go 1.7 miles to Bauer Road. (Malty becomes Hamburg Road just before Bauer.) Turn right on Bauer Road. Go .5 miles, then turn left on Teahen Road. The camp is about a mile up on the road on the right. The address is 7380 Teahen Road.

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## **COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT**

The staff at CCC and the children have consistently provided community support to various agencies in Washtenaw County and elsewhere for years. During the year we collect food for the homeless shelter, buy products and supplies for SOS, toys and gifts at Christmas and Chanukah time, and support underprivileged and homeless children with childcare assistance. This summer we will be sponsoring two community service projects.

Our first will be a partnership with Lunch 4 Learners. Lunch 4 Learners provides lunches to children through Food Gatherers. The children will be decorating the paper lunch bags that the lunches are delivered in. This way every child who gets a lunch gets it in a bag that makes them feel special and thought about.

Our second project will be in support of the children and families in Rivne, Ukraine. We will be creating cards, pictures and notes to send to the children, along with a shipping container of non-perishable food. We are also working on producing a video that we could exchange with a similarly aged group in Ukraine. We are planning on recording a song of support for them in English and Ukrainian.

These projects will allow us to make a connection to children and families who need a little boost right now. In addition, it continues our message that all people should be treated with respect, kindness, and dignity.
